Deer stalking is a [British](#) term for the stealthy pursuit of deer on foot with intention of killing the deer for meat, for sport, or to control the numbers.^[1] As part of a land management programme, just as with [bird hunting and shooting](#), the aim with deer stalking is to reduce crop damage and to obtain food. Also, as with hunting, deer stalking has long been considered a [sport](#). Stalked deer are commonly shot with a high powered bow (in countries other than the UK; in the UK it is illegal to hunt any animal with a bow) or centre-fire rifle; prior to the invention of the modern rifle deer were stalked with the aid of a [sighthound](#), such as the [Scottish Deerhound](#).^{[2][3]} Stalking sticks are often used to steady the aim of the rifle and to steady the binoculars when scanning the ground.^[*citation needed*]

The term "deer hunting" is used in North America for the shooting of deer, whilst in Britain and Ireland the term generally refers to the pursuit of deer with [scent hounds](#), with unarmed followers typically on horseback.^[*citation needed*]
